## **ASSOCIATIONAL VBS DIRECTOR DUTIES**

Generally, the Associational VBS Director is enlisted by and is responsible to the Associational Sunday School Director or Director of Missions.

- 1. Works in VBS in a local church that uses LifeWay's VBS curricula.
- 2. Enlists and trains an associational VBS team to conduct consultations and VBS training clinics.
- 3. Leads a team to contact churches that did not report a VBS last year and encourage them to conduct a VBS next year.
- 4. Attends the state VBS training clinic.
- 5. Becomes familiar with the features of LifeWay's VBS and Backyard Kids Club resources.
- 6. Works with Director of Missions to provide sales of VBS materials from a LifeWay Christian Store (as needed).
- 7. Plans, promotes, and conducts VBS awareness and training clinics.
- 8. Promotes VBS training in every church within the association.
- 9. Takes the lead in setting VBS goals.
- 10. Keeps mission VBS opportunities before churches and their leaders.
- 11. Informs church leaders about and facilitates VBS Link-up within the association. Encourages leaders to set goals to do the work.
- 12. Works with local Baptist Campus Ministers to enlist and train students for VBS work.
- 13. Assists in coordinating student summer missionary work in the association (as requested).
- 14. Records and reports VBS information.
- 15. Reports results of the associational VBS clinics to the state VBS promoter.
- 16. Leads a team in contacting and assisting churches in reporting VBS results.
- 17. Encourages church leaders to follow up on the outreach, educational, and evangelistic opportunities of VBS.
